## Challenge Answers

1. First attack hose line supply the tower ladder
2. Second attack hose line into exposure #4 A prevent fire spread. Skip exposure # 4

3. Ground ladder to exposure # 4 front of building, search entire building quickly
4. Primary ventilation roof scuttle of exposure # 4 A, front windows of exposure 4 A
5. Aerial (tower) ladder repositioned in front of exposure # 4 operate on fire building and alley between exposure # 4 and 4 A
6. Primary life hazard exposure #4 conduct a quick primary search of entire interior of exposure 4 and get out.
7. Interior fire spread concealed spaces
8. Exterior fire spread wood combustible shingle siding of all three buildings; The main exposure problem is # 4 A. Give up exposure 4 to save # 4 A
9. Collapse hazard fire building falling into alley
10. Worst-case scenario: People trapped in fire building, people jumping into rear yard and side alleys; fire spreads past exposure 4 A to exposure 4 B and 4 C etc.

Note: FDNY Fireground designation system (clockwise) 1. is the street 2. is the left side ( as you face the front of the building) 3. is the rear. 4. is the right side.
